Training Needs Analysis Process: User Guide for Applicants. Step 1: define the course characteristics. Define as precisely as possible the parameters of the course including: the “base aircraft” (e.g. B747-400 (PW 4000), passenger version) and, all the models or variants that will also be covered by this course.(e.g. B747-400F (PW 4000), freighter version) The description should include the airframe, engines, avionics and any major modifications (e.g. Cargo door) that will be addressed.

By means of the Training Needs Analysis (TNA) the Organisation will then determine the total amount of hours required for each course. The Part-66 has a table (here Table-2) showing the minimum duration of the courses calculated for a generic aircraft (not a specific type) and in consideration of the estimated average duration of standard type courses imparted in Europe.
