The aetiology of multiple sclerosis (MS) is generally thought to be a complex interplay between genetic 1 and environmental 2,3 factors. The findings regarding environmental factors have been inconsistent, 4 however, and many single observations on the possible role of factors such as infection 5 or diet 6 have later often not been confirmed when systematically analysed in larger populations.
