Chelonians – the group of reptiles with shells – are roughly divided into three main categories; tortoises (which dwell on the land), turtles in the ocean and terrapins in fresh water. Tortoises. Tortoises primarily live on dry land, and are most commonly encountered in hot, dry climates. Tortoises are surprisingly widely distributed, found across much of the world. North America, Mediterranean Europe and much of Asia are all examples of where tortoises may be found.

The turtle shell is a highly complicated shield for the ventral and dorsal parts of turtles, tortoises and terrapins (all classified as "turtles" by zoologists), completely enclosing all the vital organs of the turtle and in some cases even the head. It is constructed of modified bony elements such as the ribs, parts of the pelvis and other bones found in most reptiles.
